


# DaaS 3 - Using the Windows keyboard button on Chrome OS

When using a Chromebook or Chromebox, the Windows button (or equivalent Search button) is utilized by the foreground OS (Chrome OS) and not the Horizon Desktop.

## Enable Windows Key Functionality

1. Open the Settings dialog box (gear) from the Horizon client.
2. Click the slider to **Enable Windows Key for Desktops**.
